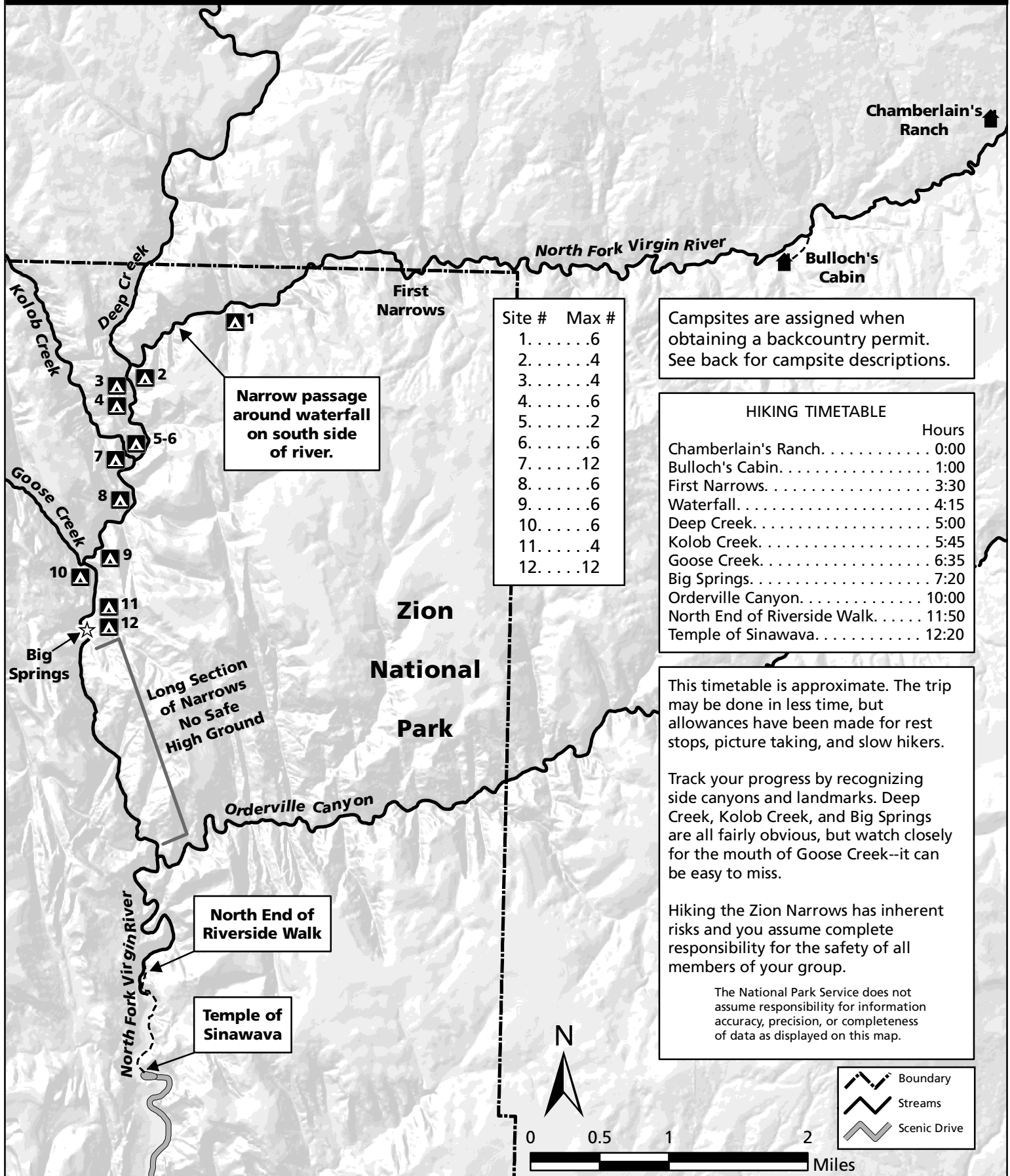

This timetable is approximate. The trip may be done in less time, but allowances have been made for rest stops, picture taking, and slow hikers.

Track your progress by recognizing side canyons and landmarks. Deep Creek, Kolob Creek, and Big Springs are all fairly obvious, but watch closely for the mouth of Goose Creek—it can be easy to miss.

▲Campsite Descriptions ▲

1. Maple Camp

A 10-minute walk beyond the Zion National Park boundary (boundary marker is not always apparent) and 250 yards upstream from the falls, this site is in a stand of maples on the left, 8 feet above the river.

2. Deep Creek

The confluence of Deep Creek is a 45-minute walk from Maple Camp. The site is located on the left side of the Virgin River.

3. River Bend

A 10 to 15-minute walk beyond Deep Creek, River Bend is located on the right side of the point of a sharp bend 10 feet above the river.

4. Right Bench

A 10 to 15-minute walk from River Bend, this site is located on the right-hand bench in a stand of maples 20 feet above the river.

5. Flat Rock

Flat Rock is a 5 to 10-minute walk beyond Right Bench, located beside a large flat rock next to the river. The camping areas are next to the rock or on a 6-foot high bench next to the canyon wall, which provides limited shelter from the elements.

6. Ringtail

A short 5-minute walk beyond Flat Rock, Ringtail is located on a right-hand bench in a sandy area surrounded by several small maple trees. It is just before Kolob Creek.

7. Kolob Creek

The confluence of Kolob Creek is a 5-minute walk beyond Flat Rock. The site is located on the right side of the Virgin River, below Kolob Creek, 20 feet above the river on a shaded bench.

8. Boulder Camp

Boulder Camp is a 10-minute walk beyond Kolob Creek around a sharp bend. To access the camp, turn right up a trail that is perpendicular to the main route and climbs 50 feet.

9. Left Bench

A 10-minute walk beyond Boulder Camp, the site is located on the left side on a 10-foot bench next to the canyon wall and in a dense grove of maples and Douglas firs. It may be easy to miss.

10. Alcove

Alcove is a 30-minute walk from Left Bench around the bend from Goose Creek, on the right side immediately below a huge streamside boulder. The camp is against an overhanging wall that provides shelter.

11. Spotted Owl

A 5-minute walk beyond Alcove, this sunny campsite is located on the left side, immediately after the first stream crossing. It is up a slope 10 feet above the river.

12. High Camp

High camp is a 15 to 20-minute walk beyond Spotted Owl on a slow, difficult section of the river, 300 yards before Big Springs. The site is on the left side of the river on a 25-foot high bench in a stand of maples and Douglas fir. It may be easy to miss.

☆ Big Springs

This year-round spring on the right side is impossible to miss. ***If you see it, you've missed your site! No safe high ground is located beyond here.***
